BIG ADDITION IN CITY IS PLANNED

Outlay Will Also Improve Dor-land-Bell at Hot Springs

The expenditure of mary thousands of dollars in the land of the Sky upon additions! buildings for schools under jurisdiction of the Woman's Board of Home Mission of the Presbyterian church, U. S. A., is nov. definitely part of a building to be launched in the near future according to information gained from Mas. Fred S. Bennett, of New York, head of the board who visited in Asheville darin the past week.
The schools immediately
this secteon efftted by the prc-
gram are Dorland-Bell at H t Springs, and the Asheville No: maI and Assnciated scholls, 0 Buncombe county.
At the former the 1923-24 building program conemplate the construction of an entirely the place "The Willows" located everal miles below the town of Hot Springs. on the French Broad river.
At the Farm school, Swain:moa, the building program contemplates the erection of doris tory space additional so that be ween 60 and 70 boys can be dded to the present enrollment It is hoped to put up one oi ese two dormitory units by ext year, the board president asserted. Recent additions to he equipment at Farm'schoo. long other lines has made it possible to increase the studer t this manner, she pointed,ou: With the purchase of 240 acres mountain land, known as the Hensley property, adjacent to he Dixie highway below Hot springs, and situated at an el vateon above the "willows farm site, the construction of a modren domitory for boys wit. a capacity of about 69, is the
