All persons who oppose the granting of said Parole are invited to forward their protests to the Governor without delay. This the 6th day of March 1924 HESTER HENDERSON.



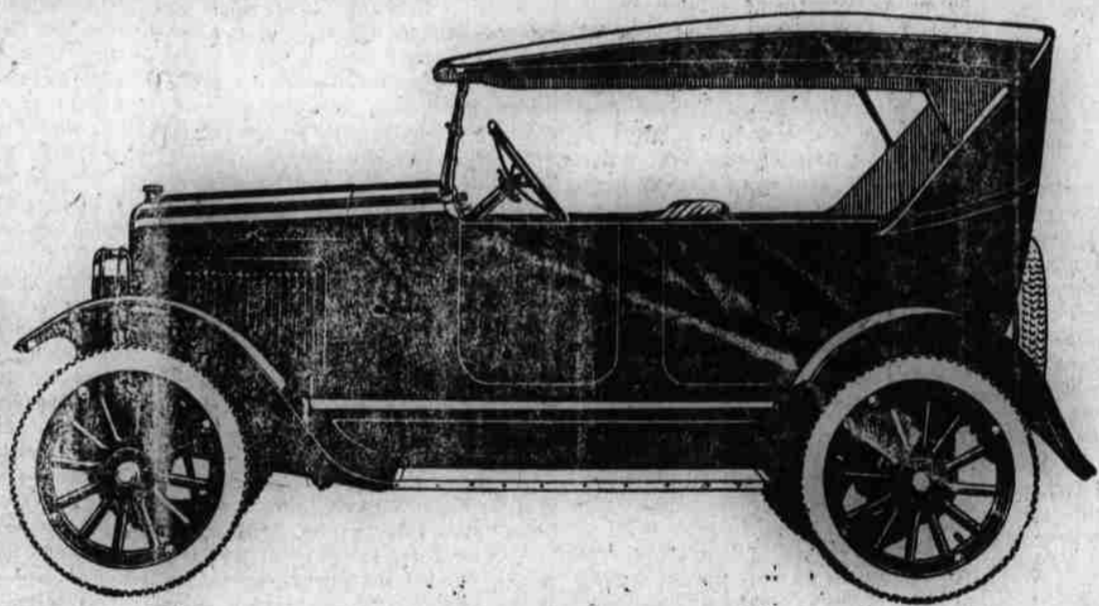
