Miss Ruth Fesler, social secretary to Hoover, found interesting details of the early life of the Hoovers in old land records at the court house yesterday. She also visited parts of Carroll County, where it was thought Andrew Hoover once lived. From information given through the records and other data it was found that Andrew Hoover after living for 15 or 20 years in what was formerly Frederick County, removed to North Carolina, where his son, John, was born. 
