#### NORTH CAROLINA, MADISON COUNTY.

Regular meeting, Board of Commissioners, Madison County, held in the Courthouse at Marshall, on the 7th day of January, 1929. Present at said meeting, C. J. Wild, Chairman, T. A. Silver and J. F. Ammons, Members, being the full Board.

WHEREAS, a petition was presented to the Board of Commissioners of Madison County, on the 15th day of December, 1928, signed by more than 200 resident freeholders of Madison County, and more than 150 of said petitioners residing outside of the corporate limits of the Town of Marshall, and

WHEREAS the names subscribed to said petition were duly certified to the Board of Commissioners, and

WHEREAS, upon said petition the Board of Commissioners ordered a special election to be called on the 9th day of April, 1929, the said petitioners requesting an election to be called for the purpose set forth in said petition, the following being a copy of the same:

**MADISON COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA.**  
A PETITION REQUESTING THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF MADISON COUNTY TO CALL AN ELECTION FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING THE PROPOSITION OF ESTABLISHING AND MAINTAINING A PUBLIC HOSPITAL IN MADISON COUNTY.

WHEREAS, the Duke Foundation, through its duly authorized representatives, in order to encourage the establishing and maintaining a public hospital in Madison County, has offered to donate a sum practically equal to the amount that the County of Madison may provide for such purpose, and

WHEREAS it has been made to appear, in order to better protect the life and health of the people of Madison County, and especially that class of the citizenship of limited means, that there is a great demand and need for such a hospital.

NOW THEREFORE, we the undersigned residents, freeholders of said County respectfully request the Board of Commissioners of Madison County to call an election for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of said County the proposition of said County of Madison, issuing and selling \$37,500.00 of thirty years serial bonds, and to levy a tax for the payment of said bonds and interest thereon, the amount of said bonds to be supplemented by a donation from the said Duke Foundation. The said money to be expended in purchasing a site and erecting and equipping a suitable building thereon, at some place to be selected within the corporate limits of the Town of Marshall and the said hospital to be conducted and managed as prescribed in Chapter 119, Article 2, Consolidated Statutes, N. C., Municipal Hospitals.

In compliance with said petition and the matters set forth in the preamble hereof, the qualified voters of Madison County will take notice that an election is hereby called to be held on the 9th day of April, 1929, by authority and in compliance with Chapter 119, Article 2, Consolidated Statutes of North Carolina, to determine whether or not the Commissioners of Madison County shall issue and sell serial coupon bonds, not exceeding \$37,500.00, and to levy a tax as provided in Section 2755 C. S., not to exceed one-fiftieth of one cent on the dollar for a period of time not exceeding thirty years, the said bonds and the said tax being for the purpose of establishing and maintaining a County public hospital as hereinbefore set forth.

For the purpose of said election a new registration of the qualified voters of Madison County is hereby ordered. There shall be submitted to the qualified voters of Madison County at the said election substantially the following ballot to be voted:

Yes.  
For a tax not exceeding one fiftieth of one cent on the dollar for a bond issue for a public hospital and for maintenance of same.

No.  
If a majority of the qualified voters at said election, on the proposition shall be in favor of a tax as submitted or a bond issue for a public hospital and for maintenance of same, a tax so authorized will be levied and collected in the same manner as other taxes are collected and applied to the purposes herein specified.

The said election shall be held at the regular voting precincts in Madison County on 9th day of April, 1929, and shall be conducted as provided by law for the election of State and County officers. The registration books shall be opened for the purpose of duly qualified electors registering on the 9th day of March, 1929. The registration books shall be closed for registration at sunset on the second Saturday, the 30th day of March, 1929, before said election, on each Saturday during the period of registration, the registrar shall attend with his registration books at the polling place of each precinct or ward for the registration of voters.

That each registrar shall attend the polling place of his township or precinct with the registration books, on Saturday preceding the election, from the hour of 9 o'clock A. M. till the hour of 3 o'clock P. M. when and where the said books shall be opened for the inspection of the electors of the precinct or township, and for the purpose of challenge as provided in Section 5972 C. S. That the registration of electors and the challenge of persons registered shall be conducted in all respects as provided in such cases by the Consolidated Statutes of North Carolina. #### SPECIAL SCHOOL TAX ELECTION IN NO. 2 TOWNSHIP

Notice is hereby given that a special school tax election has been ordered by the County Commissioners of Madison County, North Carolina, to be held at White Rock School House on Saturday, April 6th, 1929, to ascertain the will of the voters regarding the special school tax for said district.

The special taxing district is bounded as follows: BEGINNING at mouth of High Rock Branch down Shelton Laurel Creek to E. W. King's East Line, then with said line to Gunter Branch; down Gunter Branch to mouth of James Hensley's branch, then up said branch and including James Hensley's farm to top of Saplin Mountain, to the Cow Trail Ridge with Cow Trail Ridge to Mile Gap; then from Mile Gap to mouth of Hickey's Fork; then up Hickey's Fork to government Forest land to Allen Knob; then south to Franklin Mountain, then with Franklin Mountain to High Rock Knob—from High Rock Knob to mouth of High Rock Branch the BEGINNING. Addition by reason of (petitioning in the lands of D. C. Cook, Jack Jentry, William M. Thomas, B. G. Gunter, P. E. Franklin, Love Franklin and Suard Gosnell.

The County Commissioners have also ordered a new registration for this election in order to meet the requirements for holding such election. M. H. Tweed is appointed Registrar and James Wallin and Chapel Tweed are appointed Judges of the election. The registration book will be kept open during business hours at the store of Major Tweed from Saturday, March 2nd, 1929, through March 23rd, 1929. The following four Saturdays are especially set aside as registration days: March 2nd, 9th, 16th, and 23rd. The registration books shall be closed after March 23rd. Saturday, March 30th shall be challenge day. The election shall be held April 6th, and shall be held under the laws for holding general elections, except that no one is entitled to vote who has not registered especially for this election. The registration books shall be open at Major Tweed's store but the election will be held in White Rock School house.

At the election, those in favor of the tax shall vote a ticket on which shall be written or printed the words, "For Local Tax." Those opposed will vote a ticket on which shall be written or printed the words, "Against Local Tax."

This election is called under authority of Article 17 of the Public School Laws of North Carolina for 1923.
