In driving off they had more or less injured the lady who was keeping the filling station. The Sheriff chased them nearly to Walnut, overtaking them beyond Mrs. C. A. Clark's, where they had driven off into the hollow and had left the car and were around up in the woods. The car was searched by officers, but no liquor was found. However, a small tube, resembling nitroglycerin, was being carefully held by the officers as it was not known what it was.
