**The Flag Of The United States Of America**

The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag should be recognized by the usage of the procedure authorized by the school authorities. The Congress of the United States suggests that, "The Pledge should be rendered by standing with the right hand over the heart. However, civilians will always show full respect to the Flag when the Pledge is given by standing at attention, men removing their hats. Persons should give the proper salute."

When the Flag is raised or lowered every American comes to attention. Men hold hats; women hold their hands over their hearts. Persons in uniform salute.

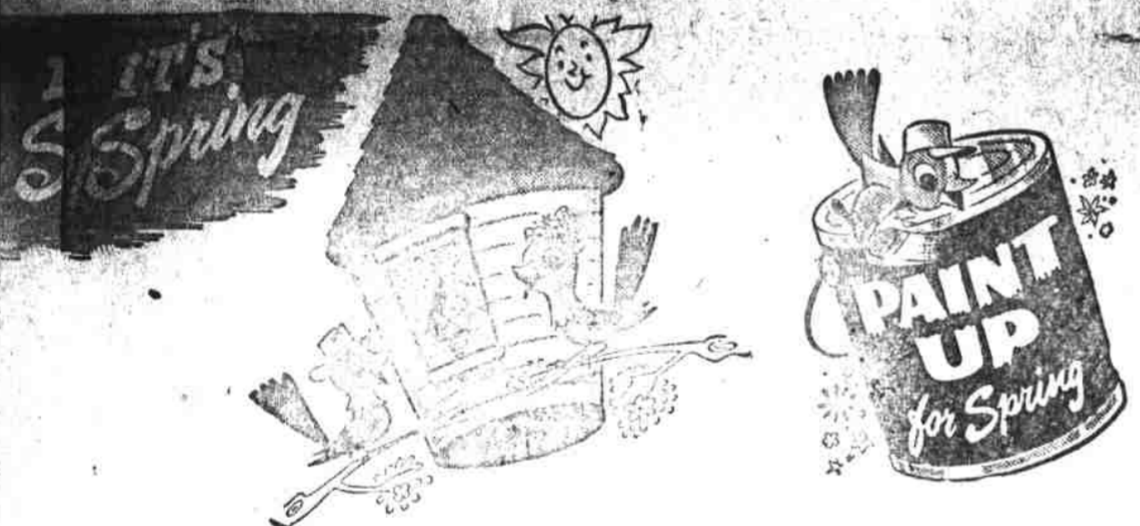
