ments — Wash often. This prolongs the life of your garments; and serves to reshape the garment, thus insuring better fit.
 Close slide fasteners, hooks and eyes when you wash foundation garments.
 Never soak. Use a small hand-brush on soiled parts. Lay the garment flat on a drainboard and brush.
 Never wring. To remove excess moisture, roll lengthwise in a Turkish towel so that hose supporters and metal fastenings cannot out the fabric.
 Smooth in shape to dry. Dry flat on a towel, or hang over a clothesline. Press only the fabric or lace sections of a girdle or brassiere. Never allow an iron to touch the rubberized sections.
 Never dry in direct heat or sunlight — both tend to cause rubber deterioration and will shorten the life of your foundation garment.

Research rules for drying rayons — Avoid too much sun on colors. Sunlight is a natural bleach and is therefore hard on all colors. Take colored clothes off the line as soon as they dry. When you have doubts about a garment's ability to stand strong sunlight, hang it in the shade or indoors.
 Don't let clothes blow in strong wind. A high wind can cause tearing, soiling and pulling out of shape, making ironing difficult.
