**Five Students At State From Madison County**

Raleigh, Nov. 17 — Among the 4,816 students enrolled at North Carolina State College this semester are five from Madison County. Figures on the county enrollment were released today by Kenneth D. Raab, director of admissions and registration, who said North Carolinians make up 82 per cent of the student body.

The Tar Heel students representing all of the State's 100 counties total 3,959. In addition, there are 699 students from 43 other states and the District of Columbia, 153 from 39 foreign countries, and five from United States possessions.

State College has six major degree-granting schools — the Schools of Agriculture, Design, Education, Engineering, Forestry, and Textiles. It is recognized as one of the nation's key Land-Grant Colleges.
