A very simple form is now available for farmers wishing to file for the refund on gasoline used on the farm. This form, "Form 2240," will be available in the county agents office, in the banks, A.S.C. office and at other places in the county. The first refund claim is due before October 1, 1956. This claim will cover all gasoline purchased for farm use since December 31, 1955 until July 1, 1956. A refund will amount to 2c per gallon.

Only four items are asked for in filing for the refund as follows: The farmer's name and address.

Gallons of gasoline purchased during the claim period.

The amount of refund claim. Instruction for filing the claim are on the back of the form and are very simple.
