The Rev. Jay Blankenship and the Rev. Frank Blalock officiated, and burial was in the church cemetery.

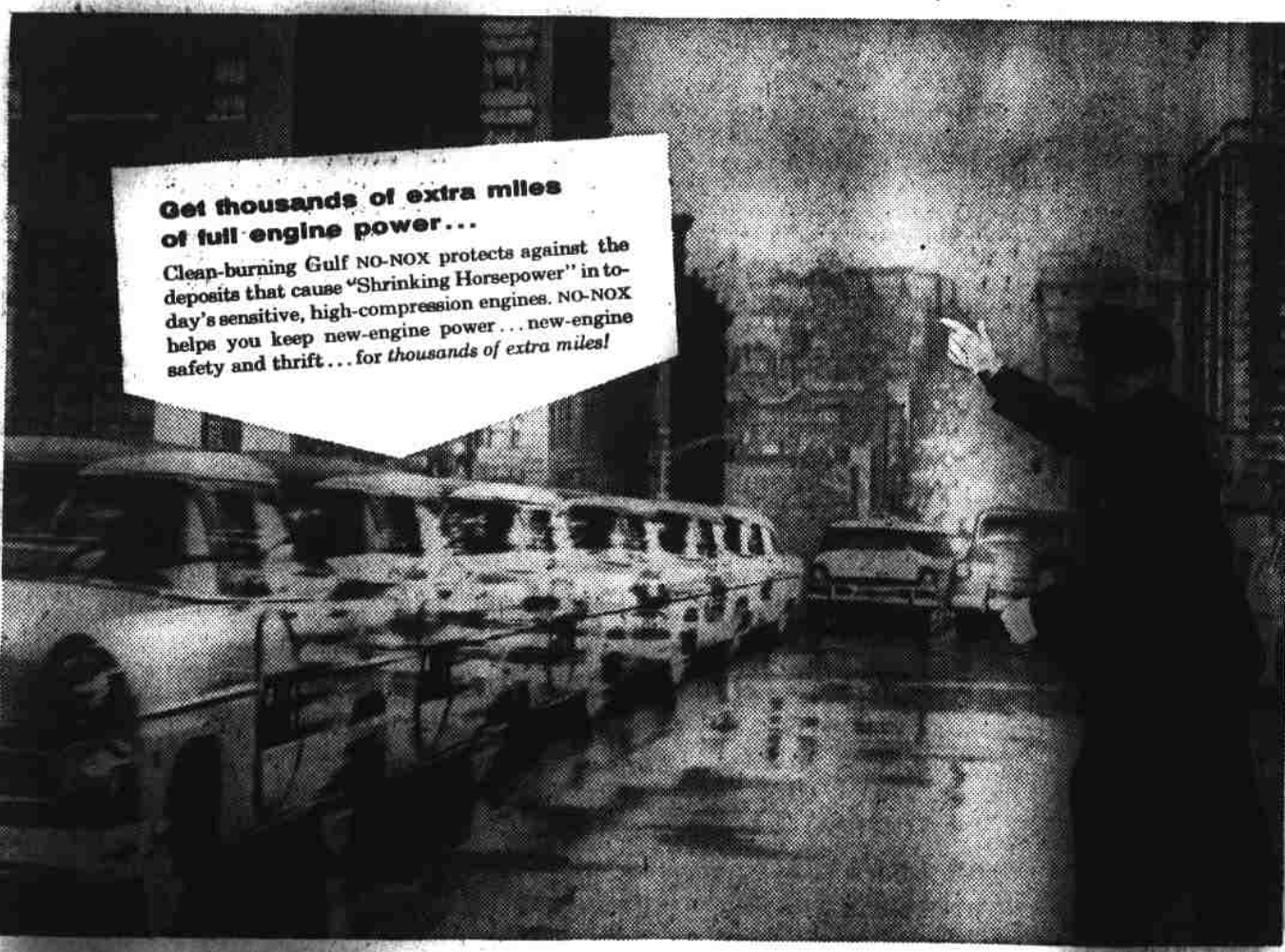
