JAM AND JELLY DAYS ARE HERE, HINTS GIVEN

Here it is almost time when we are going to be busy putting up jams, jellies and preserves. The fact is I have already tried a new recipe using the combination of rhubarb and strawberries.

Instead of using paraffin to seal the jars I used Saran Wrap and it is so much easier and far less work.

After you have poured the jam or jelly into the hot sterile glasses, then cover with squares of saran film. Be sure the edges of the glasses have been wiped clean of any preserves.

It is important to seal the glasses while the glasses and preserves are still hot for then there will be just enough heat to shrink the saran film and make it airtight.

Another trick I have found helpful is the labeling. Make labels and then stick them on the side of the glasses with transparent tape.
