This Is The Law

HAIR RINSE

Mary purchased a hair rinse at a drug store. She read the instructions on the box for its use, and followed these directions the three times she used the preparation to rinse her hair.

After its third use she consulted a doctor, who found that she had weeping dermatitis of her entire scalp, behind her ears, on her face, and somewhat down the back of her neck.

As her witness in court, the doctor testified that Mary's scalp ailment was caused by some chemical coming in contact with the scalp, but he could not say what that chemical might be.

Mary had a girl friend who testified that she had rinsed her hair with the same rinse and that it caused her scalp to become red and inflamed.

Mary sued the corporation that operated the drug store. Was Mary able to recover a judgment for damages?

This was an actual case decided by the Supreme Court of North Carolina within the past year. Mary was not permitted to recover. The Supreme Court said that the superior court was justified in nonsuiting the case - that is, in refusing to send it to the jury.

In its opinion, the Supreme Court said: "It would seem that the cause of plaintiff's dermatitis remains a matter of doubt and conjecture. It may be that she and her girl friend were allergic to the ingredients of this hair rinse. Although there are contrary decisions, it has been generally held - and it seems the sounder view - that in an action by the buyer of a product against the seller for breach of warranty to recover damages for injuries resulting from the use of the product, there is no liability upon the seller, where the buyer was allergic or unusually susceptible to injury from the product, which fact is wholly unknown to the

News for Veterans

Veterans' enrollments under 4 federal training programs have passed the 10,000,000 mark, Veterans Administration said.

The ten-millionth person to start training probably was a Korea veteran, VA added, since World War II training programs virtually have passed out of existence.

Since World War II, VA has administered all four training programs for veterans. The first - Public Law 16 vocational rehabilitation for disabled World War II veterans - came into existence in March, 1943, during the height of the war.

A total of 612,000 disabled veterans received training under Public Law 16 during the past 13 years.

Training ended for nearly all disabled World War II veterans on July 25, 1956. However, the law permits those in certain "hardship" categories to continue after that date.

The largest program of all - the World War II GI Bill - also was enacted during wartime, in June, 1944. More than half of all World War II veterans, or 7,815,000, have availed themselves of its education and training benefits.

This program, too, came to an end for practically all World War II veterans on July 25, 1956. Public Law 894, providing vocational training to disabled Korea veterans, was enacted in 1954. Since then, 44,000 disabled veterans have received training.

The fourth program - the Korean GI Bill - became law in the summer of 1952. During the past four years, a total of 1,645,000 Korea veterans have received GI training.

Under present law, veterans' training will be part of the American scene until 1968, at which time the program for disabled Korea veterans will come to an end. The Korean GI Bill for non-disabled veterans is scheduled to end in 1965.

Q-I am receiving a VA pension for non-service-connected disability. Does this entitle me to outpatient medical care for my disability?

A-No. Outpatient care is limited by law to treatment of service-connected disabilities only.
