If my guess is right, homemakers days, or I should say calendar, is filling up fast and you are a busy person in addition to spending the time with the family, many of the dates made during Christmas will mean the renewing of friendships and making new ones.

You have already baked some! And the wondrous realm of Christmas cooking abounds—well, let's say, with "Sugar plums," fragrant spices, savory herbs, fruits, candies and nuts.

Holiday Steamed Pudding with currants, nuts, candied fruits, with the essence of spices. Their flavors singly or in combination set Yule apart from that of the rest of the year. (Makes nice gifts, too). Perhaps you would like to make this one:

- HOLIDAY STEAMED PUDDING
3 C. flour
1/2 tsp. soda
1 tsp. cinnamon
1/4 tsp. mace
1 c. chopped nuts
3 eggs, beaten
2 tsp. vanilla
1 1/2 c. ground suet
2 tsp. baking powder
1/4 c. ground cloves
1 1/2 c. currants
1 1/2 c. mixed candied fruits
1 c. orange juice
1/2 c. brown sugar.

Sift together in a large bowl the flour, baking powder, soda, salt, cinnamon, cloves and mace. Mix currants, nut and candied fruits. Combine eggs, orange juice, vanilla extract, brown sugar and suet. Add liquid mixture to dry ingredients. Mix well. Turn mixture into two well greased 1-quart molds. Cover molds with a double thickness of aluminum foil or waxed paper. Tie securely. Steam about two hours. To steam, put about 1 quart wa-

ter into large covered pan with a rack in bottom. Bring water to boiling. Place molds on rack. (Cover pan and reduce heat to simmer). Remove mold from pan and let cool a few minutes before unmolding. Serve warm with hard sauce.

HARD SAUCE
1/2 c. butter
2 c. powdered sugar
1 egg white
1 tbs. vanilla.

Cream butter, add sugar gradually and beat until smooth and fluffy. Beat in egg white and vanilla. Any remaining hard sauce may be stored in covered jar in refrigerator. A special surprise—dip lumps of sugar in lemon extract, just before serving and light them.
