



SOCIAL SECURITY INFORMATION

Disabled workers who were not entitled to social security benefits under the previous requirements of the Law because they had not worked at least 18 months out of the last 36 months immediately prior to their disability may now qualify for a disability insurance payment.

The new Law still requires at least 5 years of work out of the 10 years prior to disability, but the secondary "1 1/2 years out of the last 3 years" work requirement has been eliminated. The Amendments did not change the disability severity test. In addition to the work requirements, a worker must be totally and permanently disabled for any type of employment.

Another change in the Law which will affect thousands of workers is the authorized payment of benefits to dependents of disabled workers. No payment will be made to disabled workers or their dependents unless the disabled worker is at least 50 years old.

The Law also provides that workers who become disabled before age 65 may have their earnings "frozen" for the period of their disability. The work and disability requirements for the "freeze" are generally the same as for a disability insurance payment. A "freeze" can be applied only to cases of total disability. It cannot be applied to those cases where a worker is unemployed for any other cause.

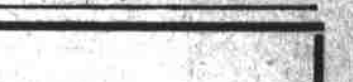
