

All growers who produced or were considered as having engaged in the production of burley tobacco in 1958 are eligible to vote on quotas for the next three crops If at least two-thirds of the growers voting in the referendum approve, quotas and allotments will be in effect on the 1959, 1960 and 1961 burley crops.
