A childless widow will receive \$60 a month if her income is not more than \$600 a year; \$45 a month if her annual income is more than \$600 but not more than \$1,200; and \$25 a month if her annual income exceeds \$1,200 but is not more than \$1,800.

Widows with minor children will receive larger pensions. Orphans have similar eligibility.
