

Plans for a \$500,000 expansion program were unveiled Monday by Hammarlund Manufacturing Company at Mars Hill.

To its present 27,000-squarefoot plant in Mars Hill, the electronics firm will add 53,000 feetbringing the total plant size to 80,000 square feet. The company already has some 10,000 additional square feet in warehouse space. Contracts were let Monday for

the new unit. Hickory Construction Co., was awarded the general contract. Other contracts were awarded to Haynes Electric Corp., Price Piping Co. (heating), and Moser Plumbing Co., all of Ashe-

#### To Begin Monday

Hammarlund Vice President Walter D. Nolte said construction would start next Monday, with December 21 set as the completion

He said the new plant would provide jobs for an additional 200 to 300 employes, about twice the number now employed.
