### JOBIE REESE, MARS HILL MAN, DIES OF INJURIES

Jobie Reese, 22, of Mars Hill, succumbed at 3:10 p. m. Monday in an Asheville hospital to head injuries received in a Buncombe County highway accident Sept. 8.

Reese had never regained consciousness and had remained in a critical condition at Memorial Mission Hospital since the accident, Dr. John C. Young, Buncombe County coroner, said.

The coroner had not completed his investigation Monday night and said he planned to conduct an inquest later in the week.

At the time of the accident, Highway Patrolman L. O. Wright reported that Reese was injured in a two-car collision about 7:45 p. m., Tuesday, Sept. 6, on U. S. 19-23 just north of Asheville.

Reese and Tommy Ledford, 21, also of Mars Hill, were in a car which struck another car as it was turning into a private driveway, Patrolman Wright had reported.

Ledford was discharged from the hospital after receiving treatment for head injuries.

The other car was driven by Mrs. Robena Stewart, 39, of Jonestown Road, Woodfin. She received dispensary treatment at St. Joseph's Hospital for a right arm fracture.

Reese's body was taken to Holcombe Funeral Home in Mars Hill.

Surviving are the father, Edward Reese of Mars Hill; three sisters, Mrs. Louise Ramsey, Mrs. Robert Selmon and Miss Alva Reese of Detroit, Mich.; two brothers, Paul of Detroit and Jack of Mars Hill.

### COUNTY E.P.C. MET HERE DEC. 1

An organization meeting of the County Emergency Planning Committee was held in the ASC office on Dec. 1. Members of this committee, as designated by the Secretary of Agriculture in the overall National defense plan, are: Harry Silver, County Extension Service; W. K. Anderson, Farmers Home Administration; Boyd Baucom, Soil Conservation Service; A. F. Hadcock, Forest Service; and Ralph Ramsey, ASC.

Ralph Ramsey, ASC office manager, was designated as chairman of the county group by the State Emergency Planning Committee. The county EPC named Boyd Baucom as its deputy chairman and the following succession of command was established to become effective in case the chairman should become unavailable in an emergency: Boyd Baucom, Harry Silver, W. K. Anderson, and A. F. Hadcock. The first Monday of each month at 1:30 p. m. was set as the regular meeting date of the committee. The next few meetings will be devoted to a study and discussion of various National bulletins pertaining to the duties and responsibilities of the county EPC. The Secretary of Agriculture announced the establishment within the U. S. Department of Agriculture of a county emergency organization and assignment of emergency planning activities essential to meet food and feed needs and other agriculture requirements of the Nation in time of a national crisis. This plan provides for the

establishment of a USDA Emergency Planning Committee at both the state and county levels. The intent of this action is to help carry out the departments responsibilities under the National plan for civil defense mobilization, promulgated by the President of the U. S. The major objective of the plan, according to the Secretary, is the development of a "built-in-readiness" integrating, insofar as feasible, defense planning as a part of regular and continuing programs and activities.
