Barring a last-minute change of plans, I will enter the Memorial Mission Hospital next Tuesday afternoon and will undergo a cataract operation on my right eye Wednesday morning — for more than a year my vision has been becoming progressively clouded and for the past several months it has been most difficult for me to read — in recent weeks I have used a magnifying glass whenever I attempted to read newspapers, letters, and "copy" — this has been far from satisfactory and I have missed reading a great deal — it's really hard to try to edit a newspaper without being able to read — actually, my secretary has served as my eyes, reading to me most of the copy for the newspaper — my wife has served as my chauffeur as well as my eyes at home, often reading articles of interest to me — in the past few weeks my vision has become so impaired that it is most difficult to recognize people I pass on the sidewalk — especially when the sun is shining — although I still drive my car, it is with the greatest of caution — I can't honestly say that I'm looking forward to the operation but I am looking forward to regaining my vision — while hospitalized and while recuperating I am leaving the business in the hands of my staff — I feel they will do a good job and I hope they will receive the cooperation I get — I feel that their duties and responsibilities will be made easier if you will help in any way you can in preparing copy or phoning in news — I'm going to miss being around for quite a while, but I have faith that everything will be okay —
