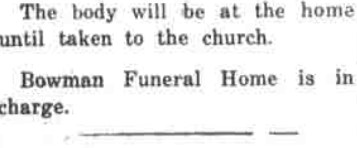
The Rev. Harold Cable and the Rev. Horace Honeycutt will officiate, and burial will be in the church cemetery.
