BERRY TARTS

2 cups sifted enriched self-rising flour ½ cup shortening

3 to 5 tablespoons cold water Cream Filling

Cut or rub shortening into flour until mixture is crumbly. Sprin-kle with water, mixing lightly until dough begins to stick together. Turn out on large sheet of lightly-floured heavy duty aluminum foil. Press dough together. Roll out to %-inch thickness. Cut six 5-inch circles, cutting dough and foil together. Prick pastry circles gently with fork to avoid piercing foil. Lift circles and shape dough and foil together, fluting edge to form tart shells. Place on baking sheet. Bake in hot oven (450°F.) 10 to 12 minutes. Cool. Remove foil and fill tart shells with Cream Filling. Cream Filling

2 tablespoons milk

2 tablespoons milk 1 teaspoon vanilla extract 1 cup whipping cream, whipped 1 cup sliced strawberries

2 tablespoons sugar Soften cream cheese. Add milk, sugar and vanilla extract, beating until smooth and well blended. Whip cream and fold in cream cheese mixture. Add strawberries. Spoon into cooled tart shells.


The cause of their hatred lay in their own evil hearts.
