

**Berry Tarts**

**A Pretty And Delicious Dessert**



Bake a Berry Tart — it's so easy with convenient self-rising flour, fresh strawberries and a few other ingredients. The little Berry Tarts will be a picture-pretty dessert for all your spring and summertime serving.

Bake the tart shells from self-rising flour that has salt and leavening added to give you tender, slightly puffy pastry. The filling is a quick and easy one made of cream cheese, whipping cream and sliced strawberries. Substitute another fresh fruit, if you like.

As a nutrition conscious meal planner, you'll be pleased to have a dessert idea like Berry Tarts. Enriched self-rising flour will provide B-vitamins, iron and calcium in the pastry. Try enriched self-rising flour in all your home baking — for both nutritional benefits and preparation convenience.

**BERRY TARTS**

- 2 cups sifted enriched self-rising flour
- 3 to 5 tablespoons cold water
- 1/2 cup shortening
- Cream Filling

Cut or rub shortening into flour until mixture is crumbly. Sprinkle with water, mixing lightly until dough begins to stick together. Turn out on large sheet of lightly-floured heavy duty aluminum foil. Press dough together. Roll out to 1/4-inch thickness. Cut six 5-inch circles, cutting dough and foil together. Prick pastry circles gently with fork to avoid piercing foil. Lift circles and shape dough and foil together, fluting edge to form tart shells. Place on baking sheet. Bake in hot oven (450° F.) 10 to 12 minutes. Cool. Remove foil and fill tart shells with Cream Filling.

**Cream Filling**

- 3-ounce package cream cheese
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 2 tablespoons milk
- 1 cup whipping cream, whipped
- 2 tablespoons sugar
- 1 cup sliced strawberries

Soften cream cheese. Add milk, sugar and vanilla extract, beating until smooth and well blended. Whip cream and fold in cream cheese mixture. Add strawberries. Spoon into cooled tart shells. Makes 6 tarts.

**Marines To Select Qualified High School Seniors**

Sgt. C. A. Johnson, local Marine recruiter for the Marshall area, today announced that he has received permission to select qualified high school graduates and seniors between the ages of 17 and 28 for enlistment in the Marine Corps' special 120-day Delay plan. The enlistment option, said the sergeant, will afford those men ready to graduate an opportunity to enlist today but leave for training anytime within the 120 day period.

Johnson, would enable men to actually enlist today; remain home and in school until graduation; be in an advanced position for promotion; be eligible for an automatic pay raise practically upon commencement of training; and at the same time serve a portion of his military obligation.

Sgt. Johnson said the pageantry and world-wide travel, including advantages offered every Marine, are standard options under the 120-day delay enlistment.

**ACP REPORTS DUE MAY 21**

Farmers who have already enrolled in the county's 1963 Agricultural Conservation Cost-Sharing Program for the spring period have the responsibility of completing and filing a timely performance report on their approved practices. In commenting on this responsibility, ASCS Office Manager, Ralph W. Ramsey, says that a vast majority of the participating farms have been very cooperative by filing timely reports. He further stated that the approvals given under the spring portion of the ACP carried a report date May 31st. It was also pointed out that farmers who could not complete their practices by this date could secure a time extension by making a written request with the ASCS Office in Marshall. The Manager also explained that ACP cost-share approvals for which a performance or request for extension is not made by the report date are subject to cancellation.

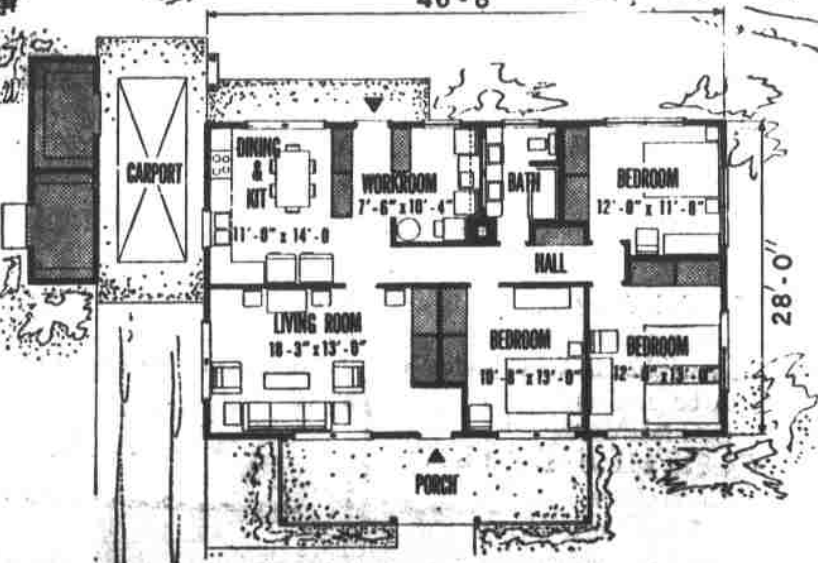
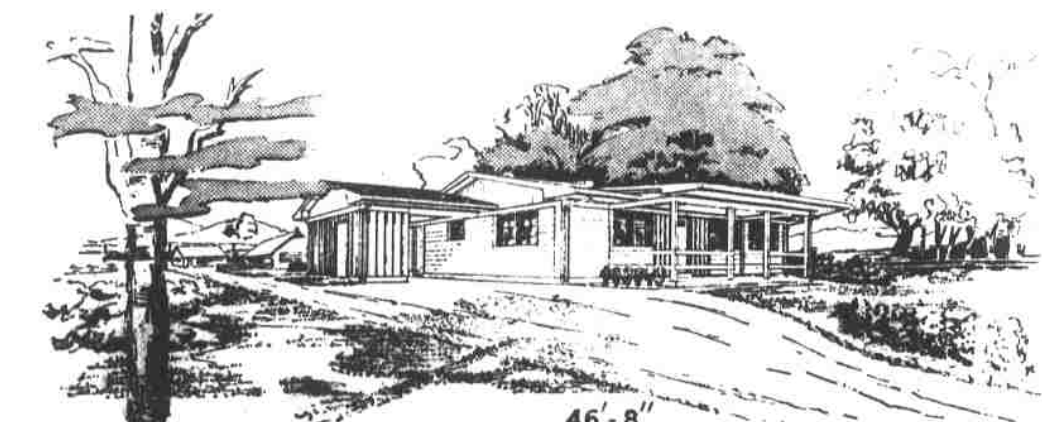

**FREE HOUSE PLAN FEATURES STORAGE SPACE**

Plans Available At County Agents Office in Courthouse

Generous storage space, a front porch, and carport are featured in this new three-bedroom house plan.

Harry Silver says the house provides privacy in the living and sleeping areas, and each bedroom has plenty of closet space. The

master bedroom is large enough for twin beds and the other bedrooms will each accommodate a double bed.

An L-shaped kitchen features liberal storage space that is conveniently located near work surfaces, and has dining space for six people. A large picture window in the kitchen gives an unobstructed view of the backyard play area.

Storage walls serve as partitions for the rear-entry hallway. The wall facing the kitchen is designed for storage of canned foods, cleaning equipment and an ironing board. The other storage wall, which opens into the work-

room, provides space for work clothes.

The house has more than 1,800 square feet of living space and the front porch and carport (with storage) add another 546 square feet.

The plan provides for slab-on-grade construction. Harry says the house should be located so prevailing summer winds will not carry livestock odors and dust to the house.
