Big Flats, N. Y. — William T. Smith, a farmer, hopes to make taxpayers angry because of his new \$6,100 Cadillac. To help anger them, he's placed this sign on the car: "we bought this car with money we received for not growing corn."

Smith, owner of a 1,200-acre dairy and poultry farm in south-central New York state, has received \$3,049 so far and is to get another \$3,450 for keeping 104 acres out of production.

This is the way Smith is protesting the Federal Government's crop-control program. He claims that paying taxpayers' money to farmers to keep land out of production is not "morally right."
