superintendent, Spring Creek School principal and Spring Creek School committee chairman, five per cent "solely for the benefit of the Spring Creek School and for such purposes relating thereto as a majority of the committee may seem advisable;" to a committee composed of the county school superintendent, Hot Springs School principal and the school committee chairman, 25 per cent for the Hot Springs School; to the town for additional law enforcement, five per cent; and the remainder (31 and two thirds per cent) to the town of Hot Springs general fund.

The bill specifies that the authority for holding the Hot Springs election shall be void if within 60 days of ratification of the law, a countywide ABC election is held. Ramsey emphasized that the election authority provided related only to liquor sales, and "has nothing to do with beer or wine." He said two of the three town commissioners had requested the introduction of the bill and that he had not been contacted by the third. The commissioners acted after receiving a petition from several leading citizens of the town, requesting legislation, according to Ramsey.

In introducing the bill—always a potentially controversial measure both locally and in the legislature—Ramsey said he was doing so merely as the county's representative at the request of town

a youngster's license would be suspended for 30 days. For three such violations the suspension would be three months and for four violations it would be a year. Sixty-day suspensions would be imposed for accidents involving personal injury or property damage exceeding \$100.

The inspection bill approved by the Senate committee empowers the Governor's Coordinating Committee on Traffic Safety to establish a system for safety inspections. The inspections would be in state licensed garages and the checks would cover brakes, lights, tires, horn, steering mechanism, and windshield wiper.

The inspection system would go into operation after next Jan. 1. There would be only one inspection the first year but after that the coordinating committee would be empowered to require semi-annual inspections. Motorists would pay \$1 for the inspection. The state would get 25 cents of this and the inspection station would keep the remainder.

Auto inspection is one of the key planks in Gov. Sanford's nine-point highway safety program.

The undersigned, being registered voters of the Town of Hot Springs, Madison County, North Carolina, have requested the Legislative Delegation of Madison County to prepare and introduce an enabling act at the 1963 Session of the North Carolina General Assembly which will provide for the calling of an Election to determine the following:

- (1) The question of whether or not the establishment and operation of a State Controlled Alcoholic Beverage Store shall be legal in the Town of Hot Springs North Carolina.
- (2) Provide the following net profits as follows:  
33 1/2% General Fund (County).  
5% Spring Creek School.  
25% Hot Springs School.  
5% ADDITIONAL Law Enforcement, Town of Hot Springs.  
31.2/3% Balance General Fund, Town of Hot Springs.

(3) Provides (3) three man A.B.C. Board appointed by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Hot Springs, N. C.  
(4) Provide a (3) three man Board to each of the aforementioned Schools consisting of the Supt. of Madison County Schools, Principal of each High School and the Chairman of each Local School Committee.

## FRUIT AND SPICE RICE MOLD—A TREAT WITH MAIN DISHES



Sopped uncooked spiciness and whole grains—good innately when stirred into hot cooked rice with melted butter and seasoning to a quickly prepared Fruit and Spice Rice Mold.

Use a decorative mold for the rice blend, if you wish, or simply mold it in a mixing bowl and garnish it for serving with spruce "ears" and cuts of fresh parsley. The important thing is to serve it hot with chicken, ham, or broiled lamb chops—any main dish that is enhanced by a luscious flavored accompaniment.

To process enough moldable rice for the mold, use the easy 1-2-4 method. For each 3 cups of cooked rice needed, use 1 cup of uncooked white rice, 2 cups water, and 1 teaspoon of salt. Combine in a saucepan; heat to boiling; stir once or twice; lower heat, cover tightly, and simmer for 14 minutes, or until all liquid is absorbed. For the Fruit and Spice Rice Mold, you would double the amount of rice, water, and salt, but the cooking time would remain the same.

- 6 cups hot cooked rice
- 1/4 cup raisins
- 1/2 cup chopped, uncooked apples
- 1/4 cup melted butter or margarine
- 1/2 cup minced almonds
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
