It took years of hard work for George Washington Carver, the Negro scientist, to equip a laboratory and to make productive the poor soil he had. He developed nearly 300 by-products from peanuts. His discoveries are today the foundation for industries worth millions of dollars.

The soil with which he worked seemed at first completely valueless. But Carver did what he frequently advised others to do—he made us of what he had at hand.

Carver had a faith that brought him victories. Many of us have talents that are unproductive only because they are unused. When we put our faith in Christ, He is able to meet us in every circumstance in life and so bring victory in our daily tasks.
