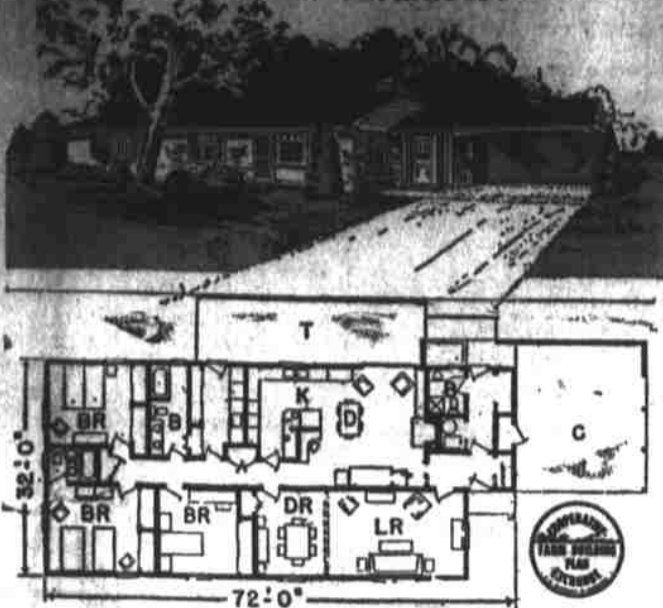

Deed, Trustees Confirmed For Station Cemetery

NORTH CAROLINA MADISON COUNTY

This Deed, made and entered into, this 20th day of August, 1963, by and between DONALD STINES and wife, LELA STINES; MRS. CORA RAMSEY (Widow of Jeter Ramsey of John); LORADO T. PONDER and wife, VIRGINIA R. PONDER, Grantors, and RAYMOND STINES, VERNON RAMSEY and BOYD PLEMMONS, as Trustees for Old Station Community Cemetery, and their Successors in office, Grantees;

WITNESSETH:

That the said Grantors, for and in consideration of the sum of TEN (\$10.00) DOLLARS, to them cash in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, and other good and valuable considerations, have remised and released, and by these presents do remise, release and forever quitclaim unto the said Raymond Stines, Vernon Ramsey, and Boyd Plemons, Trustees for Old Station Community Cemetery, and their successors in office, but subject to the manner of electing their successors, and to the limitations, reservations, and instructions, as hereinafter set out, below and after the Description, and reserving and conveying to Lorado T. Ponder and wife, Virginia R. Ponder, a perpetual easement of right-of-way to use the road where it is presently located through the premises herein conveyed to their property, all right, title, claim, and interest of the said Grantors, in and to a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Madison, and State of North Carolina, in Number 1 Township, and more particularly described as follows:

BEGINNING on an iron stake in the West Margin of the cemetery road and in the South Margin of Highway No. 25 & 70, said stake marking the common corner of Ruth R. Allen and the Cemetery Lot, and runs with said Highway, S. 50 deg. 35' E. 20 feet crossing the cemetery road to a stake in the East Margin of said Road; then leaving the Highway and runs along the lower bank of the cemetery road as follows: S. 33 deg. 00' W. 36 feet; S. 9 deg. 30' E. 61 feet; S. 30 deg. 00' E. 200 feet; S. 19 deg. 30' E. 50 feet; S. 13 deg. 30' W. 50 feet; S. 55 deg. 30' W. 50 feet; N. 88 deg. 15' W. 50 feet; N. 71 deg. 00' W. 100 feet; N. 77 deg. 00' W. 116.5 feet to a sassafras on the South Side of the road; then leaving the road and runs S. 57 deg. 00' W. 40 feet to a stake; then N. 52 deg. 00' West 28 feet to a stake in Ponder's line; then with said line N. 26 deg. 00' E. 141 feet to a stake, corner of Ponder and Donald Stines; then with said Stines line, N. 33 deg. 00' E. 81 feet to a stake; N. 69 deg. 00' E. 69 feet to a stake in the old cemetery lot line; then with said line N. 41 deg. 00' E. 100 feet to a stake in the ditch line of the cemetery road; then with said ditch line, N. 8 deg. 00' E. 34 feet to a stake; N. 26 deg. 35' E. 24.5 feet to the BEGINNING. Containing 2.31 acres, more, or less.

In the event that any one of the three Trustees, heretofore named, shall resign, remove from the community, be incompetent to serve, refuse to serve, or in any way create a vacancy in his office as Trustee, then in that event, the two remaining Trustees shall immediately meet and name a Successor to said vacancy, and shall reduce such action to writing, acknowledge the same, have same probated, and recorded in the Office of the Register of Deeds for Madison County, North Carolina, and shall cause said Register to place a reference to the book and page where the election of new Trustees is recorded on the page where this Deed is recorded.

In the event of a vacancy in the office of Trustee, and in the event that after said vacancy, the two remaining Trustees shall be unable to agree upon and elect a Successor to said Office within thirty days, after said vacancy occurs, then in that event, upon the Motion of either of the two remaining Trustees, the Resident Judge of the Superior Court of the Judicial District, which includes Madison County, is hereby authorized and requested to appoint some individual to act as umpire of said disagreement; and said umpire shall cast the third and deciding vote in the election of a Successor Trustee by voting for the individual nominated to fill said vacancy by one or the other of the two remaining Trustees.

The above named Trustees, and their successors in office, shall have full and complete control over the above described premises, and shall insofar as they are able to do with funds made available to them, for said purpose, keep and maintain the above described premises in good and proper condition for use as a Community Cemetery for the people of Old Station Community. The above named Trustees and their successors in office shall recognize and honor certain Family Lots, now located and identified upon the above described premises, and shall not interfere with existing rights as to said small family Lots, as they now exist, but the said Trustees shall have the power, right, and duty to sell at a fair and reasonable price the remaining lands, above described, to the residents of Old Station Community for family burial lots, and shall execute Deeds and conveyances to said purchasers.

Funds so received shall be used for the purpose of maintaining the above described premises as a Community Cemetery. Said Trustees shall, within fifteen days after the convening meet and convene, by electing one or more members Chairman, and another Secretary and Treasurer.
