Freeze Apples For Winter Use

Apples are the most important fruit in North Carolina. Approximately three million bushels are

produced annually with an increase expected yearly. Enough trees are already planted to increase this to five million by 1967.

Fresh apples under controlled refrigeration can now be obtained

stretch the budget. There are many forms in which you can freeze apples.

To make apple juice, pour freshly made cold apple juice (from good quality apples) into any good rigid frozen food container. Leave a little less than one-tenth of the space in the container for the juice to expand. When juice thaws, pour gently from the freezer container into a pitcher, leaving the sediment in the container. Stir the juice quickly and drink.

Frozen apple slices can add excitement to any meal. Fill containers about one-third full of 50 per cent syrup (in which you have dissolved the amount of citric-acid mixture called for on the acid container). Slice washed, peeled apples into syrup. Be sure all slices are well covered. You may want to adjust the amount of syrup.

Stuff, cored, raw apples with a mixture of cooked dried fruits (dates, apricots, and prunes, for example) and nuts or other good mixture. Bake and chill. Pack in frozen food containers and freeze. Serve hot or cold. Use your favorite recipe for quartered apples baked with butter and sugar. Cook them slightly underdone. Chill. Pack in frozen food containers, preferably ones in which you can reheat the apples. Freeze. Heat and serve.

Increase In Sales Reported By Enka

An increase in sales and net income for the first 36 weeks of the year was reported today by American Enka Corporation, producer of man-made yarns and fibers and wire and cable.

Net sales were \$99,321,000, up seven per cent, compared with \$92,931,000 for the same period of 1962. Net income was \$5,726,000, or \$2.19 per share, up slightly from \$5,721,000 for the first 36 weeks of last year.

Sales for the third quarter reporting period of 12 weeks totaled \$32,690,000, compared with \$29,593,000 during the corresponding period last year. Net income for the third quarter was \$1,718,000, while for the same period of 1962 it was \$1,674,000.

"Third quarter shipments of both rayon and nylon yarns were somewhat lower than the first and second quarters because of the vacation periods of textile mills which usually occur in early July," according to Philip B. Stull, board chairman and president.
