Your Social Security

The following are questions people have asked me recently:

Q—I am a widow. My two children and I receive monthly social security benefits. My 17-year-old daughter will be married on October 20 of this year. When will her benefits end?

A—Benefit checks end with the month before the event affecting payments occurs. Your daughter's check for September, the one that is received in the mail about October 3, would be the last she is entitled to receive. And don't forget to report her intended marriage to your social security office, so she won't be overpaid.

Q—I intend to move to another State in the next few months. When should I report my change of address?

A—To avoid any delay in the receipt of your social security checks, notify the social security office before the middle of the month in which you expect to move, so your check will arrive on time next month at your new address. Be sure to notify the post office of your change of address also, so your check can be forwarded if your new address did not reach us in time.

Q—Can I telephone the social security office to tell them my new address?

A—No. A notice of change of address must be in writing. It should be signed by the person to whose order the check is made out. Be sure to place your claim number on the correspondence.

Q—My husband died and I receive benefits for myself and my son. If he is adopted, will our monthly social security checks stop?

A—Your payments will stop because you no longer have your son in your care. His checks will stop with his adoption, unless he is adopted by a step-parent, grandparent, aunt, or uncle.

two years. I retired two years ago but I am now going to return to work. Is it necessary that I notify the social security office?

A—Yes, you should get in touch with the social security office. The amount of your wages will determine how much of your monthly benefits you will receive. If your earnings are \$1200 or less for the year you will receive all of your benefits; if they are above that figure, the amount of benefits that can be paid to you will depend on the amount of your total earnings and whether you work in all months.

Q—I am 74 years old and after having received social security benefits for five years I will return to work. Do I have to report this to the Social Security Administration?

A—No, beginning with the month of your 72nd birthday, you can be paid all your benefits regardless of how much you earn. And if your earnings are large enough, they may even make it possible for your benefit amount to be raised. If you think this might be the case, take a statement of wages paid (Form W-2) to the social security office at the end of the year, and the people there will see if you are eligible for a re-computation of benefits.
