

TWO MANAGERS ARE NAMED BY DAN K. MOORE

A former congressman and a Nashville attorney were named Sunday to manage gubernatorial candidate Dan K. Moore's campaign in the state's western and eastern counties.

State campaign manager Joe Branch announced that Woodrow Jones of Rutherfordton, former state Democratic party chairman and ex-congressman, will conduct the campaign in the West.

I. T. (Tim) Valentine Jr., of Nashville, a former member of the Legislature, will head the organization in the East.

Jones, a native of Rutherford County, attended Mars Hill College and was graduated from the Wake Forest Law School in 1937. He was city attorney in Rutherfordton from 1941 to 1943 and served as solicitor for the Rutherford County Recorder's Court from 1941 to 1944.

Strawberries For Additional Income

Harry G. Silver, county agent, states that for the past three years a number of the Madison County farmers have been purchasing Tennessee Beauty strawberry plants ordered for them by the county agricultural extension office. Plantings made with these plants have been doing an excellent job for the farmers and home-makers. There is more acreage of strawberries in the county now than at any time during the past fifteen years. The majority of these strawberries are being used for home consumption. There will be some surplus strawberries for sale this year in the county if the season is favorable.

There is an excellent opportunity for an additional cash income in every community in Madison County from the sale of strawberries. The county Extension office will be taking orders for strawberry plants again this year. The price will be approximately \$10.00 per thousand. Farmers who are interested in these plants are urged to contact the county agricultural agents in the courthouse as soon as possible in order that arrangements may be made with the nursery producing the plants.
