**West Jefferson To Bristol Excursion Sunday, Oct. 11**

West Jefferson — Sunday, October 11, the annual Autumn Leaf Train Excursion on the famous Virginia Creeper from West Jefferson to Bristol and return is scheduled to make its popular run and is expected to attract hundreds of visitors as well as local patrons. The capacity of this train is limited and tickets must be purchased in advance. A number of orders for tickets have already come in, October 1 is the last date that tickets with lunch can be purchased.

In addition to scenic beauty through the mountains and across White Top, where the autumn colors are expected to be at their best, there will be other special entertainment including string music.

The excursion train will leave West Jefferson at 9:00 in the morning and return in the afternoon around 5:30. A worship service is planned enroute at White Top with hymn singing. The tentative schedule includes brief stops at Bristol, Abingdon, and Damascus, Va., with official greetings and some brief entertainment.

The West Jefferson Woman's Club will sponsor the excursion and the Ashe County Rescue Squad will cooperate with this organization. Mrs. Ed M. Anderson is the general chairman.

An old fashioned square dance is planned for Saturday night and all visitors who have purchased tickets for the train will be admitted free.

There will be suggested short tours for Saturday afternoon, including the Northwest Trading Post where a wide variety of crafts is featured.

There will be both a doctor and nurse on the excursion, train officials said, and a space equipped as a first aid room.



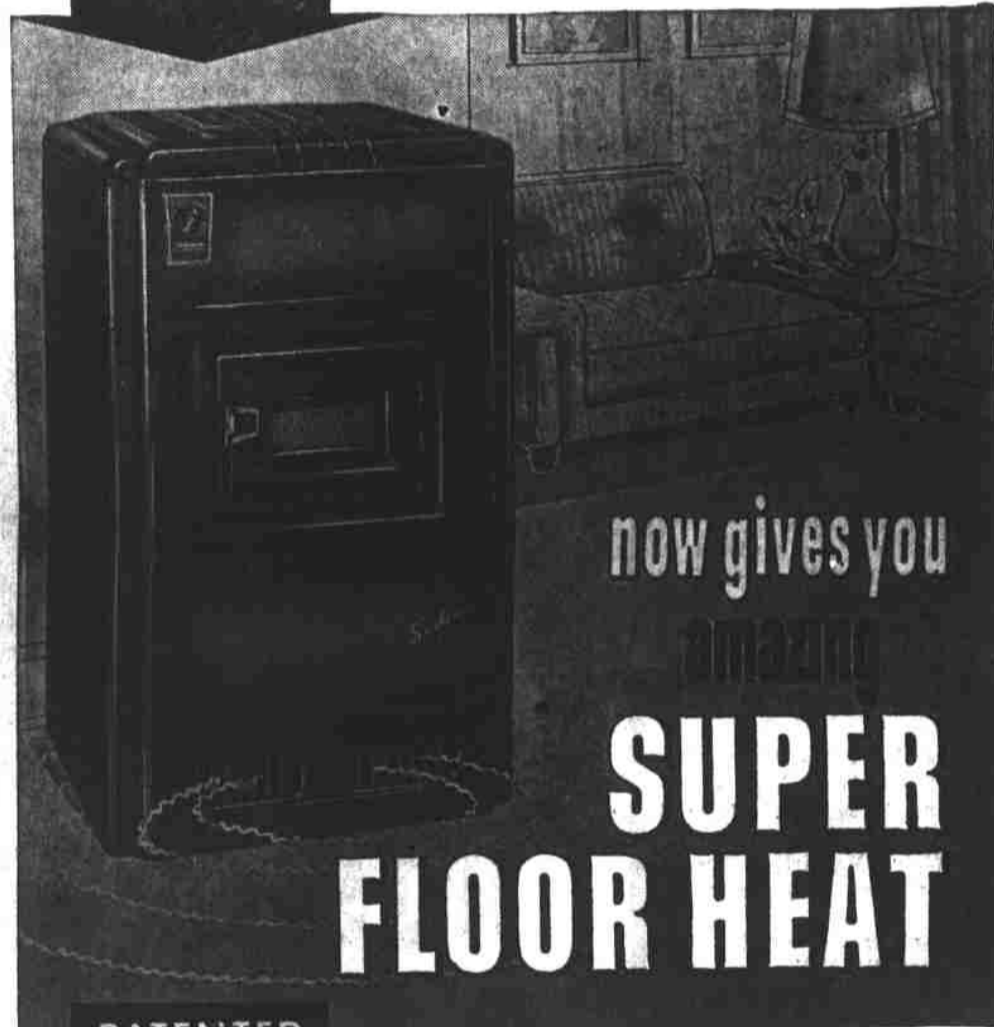
**Silver Dollar Club For Bus Drivers**
