Air Assault II, Fort Jackson, S. C. (AHTNC) — Army Sgt. James E. Buckner, son of Mr. and Mrs. Mert Buckner, Rt. 5, Box 117, Marshall, and other members of the 11th Air Assault Division are scheduled to participate in Exercise AIR ASSAULT II. The month-long field training maneuver will be conducted in the tri-state area of Georgia, North and South Carolina, from Oct. 14 to Nov. 12.

The division level exercise area will cover 4.5 million acres of privately-owned land. The purpose of the field problem is to determine whether advances in light aircraft capabilities and new technology can be employed to improve battlefield mobility and combat effectiveness of U. S. ground forces.

Sergeant Buckner, a gunner in the division, will undergo extensive training in tactical and support problems during the field exercise.

The sergeant is regularly assigned to Battery C, 5th Battalion of the division's 38th Infantry at Fort Benning, Ga.

**Forestry Project
To Start Near
Asheville Tuesday**

Asheville — Assistant Secretary of Agriculture John A. Baker will be main speaker October 20 at a ceremony near here marking the official start of the huge Cradle of Forestry in America project.

Baker also will lay the cornerstone for a Visitor Center, the first building to go up in the Cradle, located in the Pink Beds, Pisgah National Forest, about 20 miles from Asheville.

Edward Cliff, Chief of the U. S. Forest Service, will introduce Baker. Governor Terry Sanford of North Carolina, Governor Frank Clement of Tennessee, Governor Donald Russell, South Carolina and Georgia Governor Carl Sanders have been invited to attend North Carolina's congressional delegation also has been invited.

A feature of the ceremony will be the placing beside the cornerstone of letters and messages from national leaders. The time capsule in which these are placed may be opened October 20, 2064. President Lyndon Johnson, Secretary of Agriculture Orville Freeman, Cliff and leaders of the forest industry will be among those sending messages or letters for the capsule.

The cornerstone ceremony will be part of the program of the joint annual meeting of the American Forestry Association and the North Carolina Forestry Association, opening in Asheville October 18.

And the first tract of land bought under the authority of the Weeks law later became a part of Pisgah National Forest. It was under the Weeks law authority that land in the Eastern United States was purchased for the National Forest System.
