The chairman stated cost-shar ing through the county ACP is who haven't enrolled in this voluntary program if a farm need exists. He said the recommended spring seeding date for establishing a vegetative cover of grasses and/or legumes ends on May I but that other practices such as the use of lime or fertlizer to improve presently established vegetative covers or tile drainage could be performed during the entire year when weather conditions are favorable.
