USS Enterprise (CVA-65) (FHTNC) — Aviator Ordnance man Third Class Clifford B. Boone, USN, son of Mr. and Mrs. Mack Boone of Rt. 2, Mars Hill, is serving aboard the nuclear powered attack aircraft carrier USS Enterprise.

Currently in Norfolk, Va., after a yard overhaul and the refueling of her eight nuclear reactors, Enterprise is back loading foodstuffs, ordnance material and other supplies preparatory to resuming operations with units of the Atlantic Fleet.

In October, Enterprise will be transferred to the Pacific Fleet and will operate out of Alameda, Calif.

(AHTNC) — Pvt. Elmore T. Roberts, son of Mr. and Mrs. Geter E. Roberts, Marshall, completed an armor track vehicle mechanic course at the Army Armor Center, Fort Knox, Ky., July 20.

During the seven-week course Roberts received instruction in

the maintenance of engines, power trains and chassis units used in wheeled and tracked vehicles. The 19-year-old soldier entered the Army in January 1965 and completed basic training at Fort Jackson, S. C.

Roberts is a 1963 graduate of Marshall High School.

U. S. Army, Europe (AHTNC) — Army Pfc. William S. Reeves, whose wife, Wanda, lives on Rt. 1, Box 191, Marshall, participated in a two-day combat surveillance exercise in Germany, July 6-7.

Reeves and other members of his unit formed eight-man patrols and blocked infiltration of simulated enemy aggressors. When enemy soldiers were captured, information was gathered on major terrain features and transportation networks.

A member of Company A, 2nd Battalion of the 3rd Armored Division's 48th Infantry near Gelnhausen, Germany, Reeves entered the Army in December 1964 and received basic training at Fort Jackson, S. C. He arrived overseas last February.

The 23-year-old soldier attended Leicester High School and was employed by Bell Distributing Company, Asheville, before entering the Army.

Burlington Approves Two-for-one Split Of Common Stock

Wilmington, Del. — Stockholders of Burlington Industries, Inc., last week approved a two-for-one split of the textile firm's issued common stock and an increase in authorized common stock from 17,500,000 to 40,000,000 shares.

The stock split, effective at the close of business Friday, will provide one additional share for each presently issued share. Certificates representing the additional shares will be mailed August 10 to stockholders of record at the close of business July 23. The split will not require surrender of present stock certificates, which should be retained by stockholders.

Over 88 per cent of the textile company's outstanding stock was voted at the special meeting of stockholders, approving an amendment to Burlington's Certificate of Incorporation to increase the amount of authorized common stock and to effect the stock split.

Burlington Industries will have approximately 24,700,000 common shares outstanding after the split is effective. The company has more than 30,000 stockholders.
