great importance of maintaining a close and unifying identity with the church, of maintaining our close friendships among those who are our fellow-Christians, and setting as our goal a way of life that will attract others to our Christian beliefs and heritage. Paul exemplified this ideal Christian attitude in his day and time. Christianity was in its infancy, and the Jewish converts to the new religion were torn by the desire to embrace and believe in it, and at the same time avoid a total disregard of their rigid Jewish heritage.

It has been truly said by a poet of a bygone era that "No man is an island". God did not mean men to walk this earth alone. Fellowship was the natural, God-intended order of things. And in fellowship, we are automatically "our brother's keeper." Every thought or emotion that we have, every act or deed we do, every word we speak—touches, in some way, the lives of those around us. We can bring pain or pleasure... grief or joy... loneliness or companionship... by what we do and say in our relationship with others. It is, indeed, an awesome responsibility if we but pause for a moment and think about it!

It is this sense of fellowship that is the heartbeat of the church, for in the church people find many things. The older citizens in a community, who have watched time snatch from them the companions of their youth, find other kindred spirits and peace and security as they tread their declining years; the young, starting out in the world, with all its temptations, find their roots and strength and courage to withstand those temptations. And those who are in their middle years find succor from the problems that have beset them in the past, and those that still face them in the future. Identification with a church that is actively and fully participating in the concepts of true Christianity enriches immeasurably the lives of its congregation. For it is through close human relationships that the individual Christian broadens his horizons and enriches his spirit. And while we cannot deny that this spirit of mutual sympathy, understanding and help entails a great deal of effort, the results are well worth striving for, for both the givers and receivers benefit equally—spiritually and morally.
