### **EX-SHERIFF** L. E. BROWN DIES MONDAY

Laurence E. Brown, sheriff of Buncombe County for almost half his lifetime, died at 11:05 p. m., Monday, December 20, 1965 in Oteen VA Hospital at the age of

Past president of the National and North Carolina Sheriff's associations and long a leader in the Democratic Party organization in Asheville, he had been in failing health since the spring of 1963. In May of 1963 he was exammed at a Houston, Texas clinic for what a family spokesman described as a tumor in his throat and upper chest.

But in March of 1964, shortly after his 65th birthday, he had told newsmen that the tumor was not malignant. Mr. Brown had heen a patient at the VA Hospital since Dec. 10. He was admitted to the hospital after another Irm to the Texas clinic.

A hospital spokesman said that cause of death was cancer.

Funeral services were held on Wednesday.
