GOD'S WAY IN THE HOME

Memory Selection: "Ye fathers, provoke not your children to wrath; but bring them up in the nurture and admonition of the Lord."

Lesson Text: Exodus 20:12; Proverbs 4:3-5; Mark 7:9-13; Luke 2:51-52; Ephesians 6:1-4.

Today we start on a new Lesson Series, in which the pertinent question is: "Does God's Word have its meaning in human relationships?"

This series of lessons will deal specifically with Bible studies which provide unerring and irrevocable direction for the essential need of mankind to establish favorable human relationships with our fellowmen.

While there are many tribes and nations in the world today who know nothing of the Church and its functions, there are none that know nothing of family life.

In the family, in the home in which that family lives, lies the nucleus of community living. For in it are often found the third — even the fourth generation! From the old, the young learn, and from this learning, the young go forth to set up their own families, and pattern their adult lives upon what they observed in their youth.

What a responsibility lies upon the shoulder of parents as they recreate, nurture, guide, and let go of the young lives that come under their jurisdiction!

That the home was of great concern to God, is shown in the Fifth Commandment: "Honor thy father and thy mother, that thy days may be long upon the earth" is the first Commandment that carries a promise; the rest are couched in negations.

For the home occupied an important place in the Jewish program with the Jewish people. It was chosen by the wisest of men. He knew that it would be great temptation to forsake the Giver of this gift, and He therefore placed upon the parents the obligation to teach their children the history of their inheritance.

And it was by the Fifth Commandment that God sought to protect the home and its work. The Jews, therefore, were conscious of the need to honor and care for the old people in their family circle — those who had cared for them, fed them, clothed them, and guided them during their younger years.
