

County Board Of Commissioners Authorized To Provide Or Cause **To Be Provided Ambulance Service** After October 1

An Act was ratified in the General Assembly of North Carolina on May 11, 1967, to assure adequate and continuing ambulance services to the citizens of North Carolina.

The General Assembly understanding that due to regulations that have been imposed on ambulance service it would not be economically feasible for most of the private ambulance services to continue. They provided the people of North Carolina with a law that would provide ambulance services to the people. That in order to preserve, protect and promote public health safety and general welfare, adequate and continuing ambulance service should be available to every citizen in North Carolina.
