Around \$1,580,200 in economic opportunity loans was advanced to 1,013 North Carolina low-income rural families. In addition \$700,360 was advanced to 42 cooperatives serving more than 1.394 low-income farmers.

Some 3,311 North Carolina family farmers during fiscal year 1967 borrowed over \$12 million to aid in making farming operation adjustments and financing annual operating costs.

There were 490 North Carolina farm families receiving \$6,232,210 to enlarge their holdings to family size, buy and improve family-type farms.

Some 2,995 North Carolina families benefitted from \$27,758,-000 in rural housing funds.
