The Western District Junior Dairy Show will be held August 13 at the Western North Carolina Livestock Pavilion, Fletcher. Any boy or girl who is interested in showing a dairy animal should contact the County Agent's Office as soon as possible. It is not necessary for a boy or girl to own the animals in order to show them, but they must have either transportation to travel to the dairy to care for the animals or have the facilities at their home to board the animals while they are fitting them for the show.

The County Agent's Office will be glad to see that a suitable animal is available and will give training, showmanship and grooming. Also, transportation will be provided to get the animals to the show. There will be cash prizes and ribbons presented to the boys and girls who show animals.

Can you guess how much you are buying in the grocery store that is not food? According to "Food Topics," September, 1967, it was 25.4 percent.

The total on the cash register tape at the grocery store no longer tells how much families are spending for food. The annual survey of grocery store sales, conducted by Conover-Mast Publications, shows that one-fourth of the amount spent in grocery stores in 1966 was for nonfood items. The following shows how total grocery store sales of \$64.7 billion that year were divided among foods and nonfoods:

Food items — Total 74.6 percent
Nonfood items — Total 25.4 percent

In a recent survey taken in Madison County it was found that half of the families have incomes of \$3,000 or less and that the average education level is eighth grade.

Three-fourths of the people live in sub-standard housing and indicated that they would improve their homes if the resources were available. There was a need expressed by forty per cent of the families surveyed for more training for better paying jobs.

The Extension office is assisting people in securing training through the Employment Security Commission and the United States Department of Labor.

The Extension agents were instrumental in establishing two sections of a six weeks training conducted by MDTA and attended by 29 trainees in tomato production and management.

By working with other agencies a carpenter's training course was set up for twenty-six weeks. Eight young men were selected for the training by contacting school officials and vocational teachers in the area.

A comprehensive program in money management and home improvement is now in the planning stage.
