Personalized License Deadline Is Extended

The deadline for submitting applications for "personalized" 1969 auto license plates has been extended to Sept. 30, according to the North Carolina Department of Motor Vehicles.

A department spokesman said only about 3,600 applications had been received by the time the original deadline expired Sept. 1. The number was considerably less than the estimated 4,000 Tar Heel motorists who received personalized plates for 1968.

Personalized license plates were approved by the 1967 General As-

sembly to provide additional revenue for highway beautification and out-of-state travel advertising. The program allows motorists to select the characters which will appear on their 1969 license plate. The plate may consist of not less than three or more than six characters, including one dash (—). Words or letter combinations considered offensive, suggestive or otherwise not in good taste will be rejected.

Motorists desiring personalized plates may select characters to spell their name or initials, or to relay other special messages. Many drivers who have applied for the unique plates have chosen humorous messages, while others have used the means to promote special interests such as hobbies

Lt. Edwards was presented the award for meritorious service in ground operations against hostile forces in Vietnam.

During the ceremony he was awarded the Air Medal for more than 25 combat air assaults against the enemy.

Executive officer of Company D, 1st Battalion of the 1st Cavalry Division's (Airmobile) 5th Cavalry, he entered the Army in February 1966 and was last stationed at Ft. Jackson, S. C., before arriving overseas in August 1967. He also holds the Silver Star Medal and Combat Infantryman Badge.

The 26-year-old soldier graduated in 1965 from Mars Hill College with a B. S. degree in accounting.
