Asheville's Most Costly Fire Destroys Buildings

Mars Hill.

Estimated \$2,000,000 Loss; Dunham's, Bank Building Gutted

A \$2--million fire of unknown origin struck the heart of downtown Asheville Tuesday, gutting two buildings on Patton Avenue which housed the Bank of Asheville and Dunham's Music House.

Asheville's entire fire-fighting force furiously battled the blaze for three hours before bringing it under control and at one point soon after the fire began, three other banks and several adjacent buildings were threatened.


