Home Economics — 4-H

The 1969 tomato crop in Madison County is about the best ever. All packing houses in the county are running a good volume and the quality of tomatoes is excellent.

Some problems facing the farmers are blossom-end rot, early blight, and bacterial canker. Early blight is more difficult to control in dry weather and the recent dry weather aided in the spread of blight. Blossom-end rot was brought about by the dry, hot weather and no new occurrences should be noted now that it is raining. Bacterial canker will continue to spread and there is no known treatment for it. A good spray program will hold early blight, Botrytis blight and late blight to a minimum.

The "truth-in-lending" part of

the Consumer Protection Act of 1968 goes into effect July 1, 1969. After that, creditors must disclose to consumers what they are paying for most types of credit. The information must be given clearly and conspicuously before the credit transaction is completed — for example, in the note, or other agreement the consumer signs when he makes a credit purchase or gets a loan.

Before the consumer signs up for a revolving charge account or credit card account, he must be told how the finance charge is to be figured; the finance charge as an annual percentage rate; how long he has to pay a bill before a charge is imposed; the minimum payment required; and additional charges he may be asked to pay.

For other types of credit such as installment purchases and loans, information given the consumer must include the total amount being financed; an itemized account of charges being made; the total finance charges in dollars (not required in the sale of a home); the finance charge as an annual percentage rate (not required for certain small loans); the number, amount, and due dates of the payments to be made by the debtor; charges that will be added for late payment of installments; a description of any security the creditor will hold; and the penalty for prepayment of the debt. A customer who has signed his residence as security for a debt that is not for purchase of a home has the right to cancel the transaction within 3 business days if he changes his mind.

Poll Tax is \$2.00 — Dog Tax, \$2.00 on each open female dog and \$1.00 on each male.

There is a Special School Tax of 10c on the \$100.00 valuation in the Marshall School District (consisting of Township 1, Wards I and II, Township 5 and Township 3, Ward 2 unless persons live outside the boundary line of this Special School District). This is in accordance with a bond issue voted on by the people of this Special School District.

There is a Special School Tax of 15c on the \$100 valuation in the Hot Springs School District consisting of No. 3 Township. This is in accordance with a bond issue voted by the people of the township.
