LUAU . . . The First Annual Governor's Luau party was held at the Blockade Runner Hotel in Wrightsville Beach last Saturday. The Democrats appeared to enjoy the festivities, but at the same time the party leaders made no bones about the real battles which lie ahead if they are to remain the majority party in North Carolina. to our heroes." Ticker tape and confetti rained from the 100-story high John Hancock Building on North Michigan Avenue—Chicago's "magnificent mile" — as the motorcade passed carrying the astronauts and their families.

Near North Side beaches emptied. Squeals of admiration came from girls still in bikinis. At the Michigan Avenue Bridge Fire Department boats in the Chicago River shot streams of red, blue and green water more than 100 feet in the air. A light breeze carried some of the spray into the parade cars.
