**THE PROMISE OF RETURN**

Memory Selection: "Therefore the redeemed of the Lord shall return, and come with singing to Zion; and everlasting joy shall be upon their head; they shall obtain gladness and joy; and sorrow and mourning shall flee away."  
—(Isaiah 51:11)

Lesson Text: Psalms 126; 137: 1-6; Isaiah 40: 49; 51:1-16; Jeremiah 31.

If we are ever in doubt about the fruition of God's eternal pur-

poses for mankind, then the lesson we are studying today should dispel those doubts. For we see the Jewish exile finally realising their dearest hope — returning to their homeland.

With the death of Nebuchadnezzar, mighty Babylon began to decline in power, and Persia, who had been steadily acquiring territorial rights, overcame the Babylonians. Archives of their religious traditions had been steadfastly preserved, and the Law of Moses once again were accorded the honor that had been intended in the beginning.

OF INTENTION TO APPLY TO THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT COMMISSION FOR APPROVAL OF BONDS.

NOTICE is hereby given of intention of the undersigned to file application with the Local Government Commission, Raleigh, N. C., for its approval of the issuance of the following proposed bonds of the County of Madison, which bonds shall be subject to approval of the voters of said County at an election:

\$950,000 of bonds to finance the erection of a consolidated high school to serve all of Madison County in place of the existing high schools at Hot Springs, Laurel, Marshall, Mars Hill, and Spring Creek, including the acquisition of land, furnishings, equipment and apparatus necessary for such new building, in order to enable the County of Madison, as an Administrative Agency of the State of North Carolina, to maintain public schools in the County of Madison for the nine months' school term as prescribed by law.

The notice was first published on the 6th day of November, 1969. Any citizen or taxpayer objecting to the issuance of any or all of said bonds may file with the Local Government Commission a verified statement setting forth his objections as provided in Section 159-7.1 of the General Statutes of North Carolina, in which event he shall also file a copy of such statement with the undersigned, at any time within ten days from and after such first publication. A copy of this notice must be attached to the statement so filed. Objections set forth in said statement shall be for consideration by said Commission in its determination of whether or not it may hold a public hearing as provided by law on the matter of the issuance of said bonds.

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN,** pursuant to Article 21 of Chapter 143, General Statutes of North Carolina, as amended, that public hearings will be held by the Pollution Control Committee of the North Carolina Board of Water and Air Resources concerning rules, regulations, and air quality standards proposed for adoption by the Board for the purpose of controlling air pollution in the State.

Two hearings are scheduled to be held; one to be held on December 17, 1969, in the courtroom, Third Floor, County Building, Asheville, North Carolina, beginning at 10:00 a.m. (E.S.T.); and the other on December 19, 1969, in the Auditorium, Laboratory Building, State Board of Health, Raleigh North Carolina, beginning at 10:00 a.m. (E.S.T.).

The rules, regulations, and standards to be considered include the control of open burning, the emission of dark smoke, and standards for sulfur dioxide and suspended particulate matter.

All persons interested in the proposed rules, regulations, and standards are invited to attend one of the hearings and take part in the discussions. Persons desiring to be heard should notify the board in writing on or before the date of the hearing. Written statements concerning the proposed action may be presented at the hearing or filed with the Board within thirty (30) days following the conclusion of the hearings.

**NOTICE**

BOND ORDER AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$950,000.00 SCHOOL BONDS OF THE COUNTY OF MADISON

WHEREAS, the County Board of Education has determined that existing school plant facilities in the Madison County School Administrative Unit are not adequate for the maintenance of public schools for the nine months' school term prescribed by law, and has requested the Board of Commissioners to provide the sum of \$950,000 to finance additional school plant facilities such as are described in Section 1 of this Bond Order and which said County Board of Education has determined are necessary to enable the County of Madison, as an administrative agency of the State of North Carolina, to maintain public schools in the Madison County Administrative Unit for the nine months' school term prescribed by law;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Madison, as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Commissioners of the County of Madison has ascertained and hereby determines that it is necessary to erect in the Madison County School Administrative Unit a consolidated high school to serve all of Madison County in place of the existing high schools at Hot Springs, Laurel, Marshall, Mars Hill, and Spring Creek, including the acquisition of land, furnishings, equipment and apparatus necessary for such new building, in order to enable the County of Madison, as an administrative agency of the State of North Carolina to maintain public schools in the County of Madison for the nine months' school term as prescribed by law, and that it will be necessary to expend for such purposes not less than \$950,000, in addition to other moneys which have been made available therefor.

Section 2. In order to raise the money required to finance the cost of erecting said new consolidated high school building, and of acquiring land and furnishings and equipment and apparatus necessary for such new building, bonds of the County of Madison are hereby authorized and shall be issued, pursuant to The County Finance Act of North Carolina. The maximum aggregate principal amount of said bonds authorized by this Bond Order shall be Nine Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$950,000).

Section 3. A tax of sufficient to pay the principal of said interest on said bonds when due shall be annually levied and collected.

Section 4. A statement of the County debt of the County of Madison has been filed with the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners of said County and is open to public inspection.

Section 5. This Bond Order shall take effect when approved by the voters of the County at an election as provided in said act.

The foregoing Bond Order has been introduced and a sworn statement has been filed under The County Finance Act, showing the assessed valuation of the County to be \$21,868,384 and the net debt for school purposes, including the proposed bonds, to be \$950,000. A tax will be levied for the payment of the proposed bonds and interest, if the same shall be issued.
