

and strengthening the ability of the General Assembly to fulfill its responsibilities in our representative democracy." The study will be broad and comprehensive in scope. In order to make its findings known to the legislative and the citizens of the state, the committee shall submit interim reports as it deems necessary; and a final report which will set out the problems as it is found them to exist, together with its proposals and recommendations to resolve those problems and improve the General Assembly.
Dent stated that his recommendations alone would probably be many pages long in an effort to improve the efficiency of the General Assembly. "First and foremost is the need for a session every year up until 1868 and we find the citizens business being conducted in the same manner 101 years later. In today's world, it is impossible to anticipate the necessary flexibility to be responsive to the needs of the people. As an example, take the recent situation created by a Federal Court Order concerning the bussing of students without the necessary funds. The State should be able to aid the people and the counties prior to July, 1971. We have a responsibility in this area alone which has not been fulfilled and cannot, unless we are called into special session."

was shifted into the 24th District. The 24th District includes Madison, Yancey, Mitchell, Avery and Watauga Counties.
Roberts said the reason that he would not run for the Buncombe post was that he wanted to maintain his home in Marshall. He would be required to shift his residence to Buncombe if he entered the primary in Buncombe.
Buncombe will become a district of its own and will conform to the 28th Judicial District.
Roberts is the first Republican solicitor in the old 19th District since George Pritchard, who served from 1919 to 1921.
A native of Madison County, Roberts began his political career as clerk of the Madison County Superior Court in 1938.
After serving as a Navy Lieutenant during World War II, he won election to the State House of Representatives in 1948 and to the State Senate in 1960.
A graduate of the University of North Carolina, Roberts has served as president of the Madison County Bar Association, and he is a member of the state and national bar associations.
He served Madison also as county attorney from 1948 to 1964. That year he became mayor of Marshall and served until 1966.
He is a former teacher at Walnut High School (1981-86).
A Baptist, he is also a member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, The American Legion, the N. C. and American Farm Bureau Federations and a worker with the Boy Scouts.
He is married to the former Lucille Roberts of Marshall and they have four children.

are made of crystal-clear plastic material. The base or tray section is compartmented for diversified accessories and supplies. The cover section is hinged and comprises a hollow compartmented case. The small compartments constitute guides for slidingly mounted drawers for split-shot sinkers, hooks, small items and the line. One end compartment is provided with spools of nylon lines whose free ends are withdrawable through friction-retaining holes.
