# **227 Diplomas Awarded At Mars Hill College Sunday**

### Many County, Area Students Receive Diplomas, Degrees

Dr. Fred B. Bentley, president of Mars Hill College, Sunday asked the 1970 graduating class of this 114 year old Baptist institution to help stabilize the world through individual integrity and collective adherence to religious values.

With the past week's turmoil the country as background, Dr. Bentley read a message signed by President Nixon to the 227 graduates at commencement exercises.

It said in part: "Your chal-lenge will be that of reconciling continuity and change of giving new applications and fresh expressions to our traditional valuesespecially our concern for the C., by June 9. dignity and integrity of every individual."

Dr. E. Bruce Heilman, president of Meredith College, a Baptist senior woman's college in Raleigh, delivering the baccalaureate sermon said "Much of what we do in small colleges is to create the kinds of citizens who will accept more and more responsibility.'

Advocating the need of churchrelated education, Heilman said that church colleges have a great stake in educating for a better world only if those who are graduating have been made uniquely valuable.




