Two highway projects in Madison County have been delayed because of some new federal regulations. legislators who represent Madison have been informed by State Highway officials

The projects are for the construction of US 70 from Marshall to Weaverville and NC 213 from Marshall to Mars

Reps. Liston Ramsey and Ernest Messer, who inquired into the status of the projects this week at the Highway Building, said they were told a new federal that requirement for an environmental study could delay

the projects from three to six months

Public hearings showing the design of the roads had been slated for early this year but will probably be held this summer, probably in June or July, they were informed Corridor public hearings. showing the general route. were held in 1970.

The new regulation, which went into effect on Feb. 1 of this year, requires a study of the environmental impact of a project before a public hearing can be held, if the federal government is to participate in the financing

We regret the delay," the legislators said, "and Highway Chairman Lauch Faircloth has told us that he too. regrets the delay. But since the federal government is helping to pay for these projects and since they demand that these vironmental studies be made. there is nothing else to do but to comply

We have been assured by the Highway Commission that these studies will be pushed as fast as possible, and that the delays will be as short as the Highway Commission can make them
