hospital after a long illness.

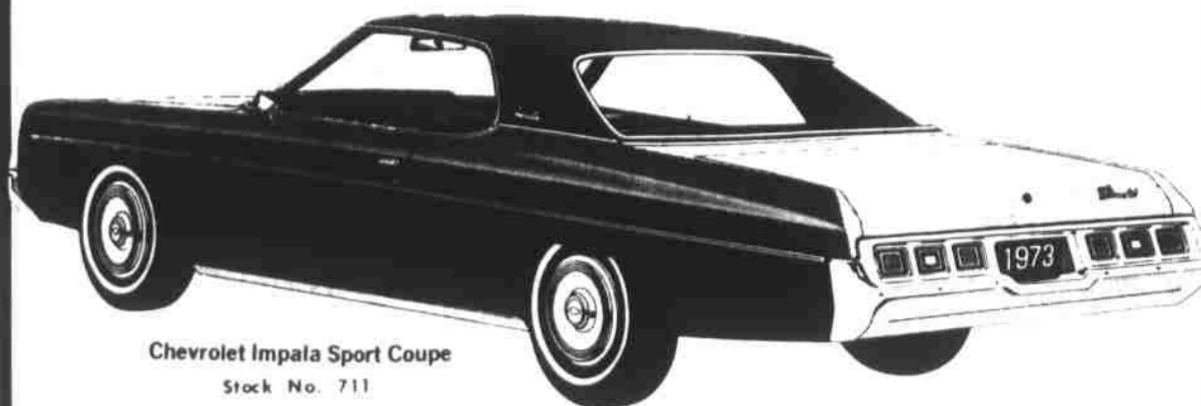
A native of Madison County,
