

Rifle Match Saturday

C. SEWER CHARGES: The following sewer charges will affect the entire town population.
A flat rate of 3.00 will be charged for sewer for residents within the city limits and a flat charge of 5.00 for businesses. Schools, housing developments and industry sewer rates will be based on water consumption as the previous policy has been.
III. Limitations on Furnishing Service
The town may refuse to furnish service where excessive costs would be involved, or where furnishing service would have an adverse effect on other customers. The town may reject any application for service when the applicant is delinquent in payment of bills for services previously supplied at any location.
IV. The town recognizes that furnishing water to customers within the town limits takes priority over furnishing water outside the town limits. Accordingly the town reserves the right to discontinue service to customers outside the town during periods of severe drought when there is insufficient water to supply customers both inside and outside the town.
The town furnishes water outside the town only, where in the opinion of the town board, this service can be furnished without undue expense in relation to revenues and without other detriment to the primary purpose of furnishing adequate reliable water service within the town.
The extension of any water lines outside the town necessary to serve new customers must be made, or paid for in full, by the customers to be served. If prospective customers lay the lines, the entire new installation must meet the specifications prescribed by the town.
Following installation of new lines outside the town, title to these lines must be vested in the town before any service is furnished. The town, thereafter, exercises complete control over the lines, and may connect new customers, and otherwise determine the use of the lines.
V. DEPOSIT
A deposit of ten dollars is required from the customer for each meter installed. The deposit is refundable when service is terminated, provided there are no unpaid arrears for service. The town may apply the deposit in whole or in part against the customer's final bill.
VI. SERVICE FURNISHED TO RENTAL PREMISES: The town furnishes service only to the landlord (owner of premises) whom the town holds responsible for the payment of all charges for service. A separate meter is normally installed for each tenant, and a separate monthly bill is rendered to the landlord for each tenant.

VII. TOWN AND CUSTOMER RESPONSIBILITIES
The town normally runs its water line to the property line of the customer where the meter is installed. The customer is responsible for the waterline on his premises. The town does not assume the responsibility of installing the customer's piping or appurtenances, and will not be responsible therefor. The town holds the customer responsible for all water passing through the meter, regardless of whether the water may be lost as the result of leaks following the freezing of pipes or from any other cause.
The town reserves the right to refuse service unless the customer has appurtenances installed in such manner as to prevent cross-connections or backflow.
VIII. BILLING, COLLECTING AND SUSPENSION OF SERVICE
Bills are due when rendered, and become delinquent (90) ten days thereafter, whereupon a penalty of 1% per month is added. If a bill is not paid by the next monthly bill is sent out, that bill is stamped with a warning notice. Payment is not made by the 10th of the month, service will be cut off.
The town strictly enforces its collection practice. A disconnect charge of \$5.00 is applied for making a disconnection, and subsequently another \$5.00 charge applies for reconnection. The reconnection is made only after arrears are paid in full.
The town reserves the right to discontinue service, without notice, in emergency repairs, or because of insufficiency of water supply beyond the town's control.
IX. ADOPTION OF RULES AND REGULATIONS
The hereinabove act forth rules, regulation and rates were adopted in a call meeting on June 8, 1976.
