Unbeaten James Madison
University snapped a halftime
tie with 10 fourth-quarter
points to upend Mars Hill
College 24-14 Saturday in a
non-conference matchup at
Harrisonburg, Va.
The Dukies sealed their
fourth win without a loss in the
final period on a 38-yard field
goal by Scott Norwood and a
39-yard gallop by Todd Martin
with four minutes left in the
contest.

The Lions, without starting
quarterback Mike Wooten at
the helm, were held scoreless
in the second half and slipped
to 2-3 for the season.
Wooten was sidelined on the
first play of Mars Hill's
opening scoring drive. After
completing a pass, Wooten
was hit hard by a Duke
lineman and sat out the
remainder of the game with a
shoulder injury.

Mark Clark capped the 24-
yard drive that followed a
Lion fumble recovery with a 1-
yard plunge. John Gulledege's
PAT gave Mars Hill a 7-0 lead
with 1:15 left in the first
quarter.

Quarterback John Bowers
of James Madison rifled a 50-
yard TD pass to Lee Walters in
the second quarter and the
first of three Joe Showker
PAT's tied the count at 7-7.

The Lions moved ahead with
4:23 left in the first half on a
flank reverse by Richard
Carter from 20 yards out.
James Madison then
marched 64 yards in 11 plays,
with a 2-yard burst by Butch
Robinson climaxing the drive
that knotted the score at the
half.
